Probation Referral Outcome (PRO) results are confidential and are considered working hypothesis. No diagnosis or decision should be based solely upon Probation Referral Outcome (PRO) results. Pretest results become the baseline for subsequent posttest comparison.

There are several levels of Probation Referral Outcome (PRO) scale interpretation. The Probation Referral Outcome (PRO) pretest (first test administration) may be viewed as a self-report and attention may be focused upon scale scores, interpreting scale elevations and understanding scale interrelationships. Here we are interested in pretest scale severity.


PRETEST SCALES

Percentile Score: 77

Truthfulness Scale: This probationer's Truthfulness Scale score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. A conscious attempt to present self in an overly favorable light is apparent. However, truth-corrected scale scores are accurate. Nevertheless, some denial can be expected in interview or when questioned.

Truthfulness Scale scores at or below the 89th percentile mean that all scale scores are accurate. In contrast, Truthfulness Scale scores at or above the 90th percentile mean all scale scores are invalid or inaccurate. This probationer's Truthfulness Scale score is set forth above.



In general, the higher the scale's score the more serious the problem. The 70th percentile is a scale's problem threshold, whereas the 90th percentile is a scale's "severe problem" threshold. Scale scores in the 70th to 89th percentile range are problematic, whereas scale scores in the 90 to 100th percentile range are severe problem scores.

Percentile Score: 73

Violence Scale: This probationer's Violence Scale score is in the problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Violent outbursts, temper tantrums and aggressive outbursts are likely. Anger management classes or outpatient (group) counseling should be considered. Anger management by itself may not be sufficient.

Percentile Score: 91

Alcohol Scale: This client's Alcohol Scale score is in the maximum (90 to 100th percentile) range. Alcohol use and abuse is indicated. Check the recovery question (#158) answer. If recovering, for how long? Chemical dependency treatment (intensive outpatient or inpatient) should be considered. Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) might augment, but not replace, treatment.

Percentile Score: 78

Drug Scale: This person's Drug Scale score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. Drug use and likely abuse is indicated. Check the recovering question (#158). If recovering, how long? Outpatient substance abuse counseling (individual or group), augmented (not replaced) with NA or CA meetings should be considered.

Percentile Score: 74

Depression Scale: This individual's Depression Scale score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. Depression is evident. Any other elevated (70th percentile and higher) scale score(s) would represent co-occurring disorders. Outpatient counseling or psychotherapy (individual or group) appears to be warranted.

Percentile Score: 69

Anxiety Scale: This person's Anxiety Scale score is in the medium (40 to 69th percentile) range. Some anxiety symptoms and concerns are evident, but anxiety does not present as a focal issue or concern. Check for other elevated (70th percentile or higher) scale scores. Co-occurring disorders can exacerbate anxiety.

Percentile Score: 77

Self-Esteem Scale: This client's Self-Esteem Scale score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem scorers devalue themselves, often feel inadequate and lack self-confidence. This probationer has problematic or negative self-esteem. Any other elevated scale scores could be harmful. Consider outpatient group counseling.

Percentile Score: 42

Stress Management Scale: This individual's Stress Management Scale score is in the medium (40 to 69th percentile) range. Medium risk scorers have average stress management abilities. For background, poorly managed stress can exacerbate other mental and behavioral problems. Stress management classes are not needed at this time.
